There are three terms we use to describe periods of time when we're talking about chronology.

C&R: decade. Decade has the root "dec". The plural of decade is decades – you write when I write. Decades are 10 years long. You can remember that the decathalon is an Olympic Event made of 10 separate events. I say decade you say 10. Decade – 10, 10- Decade.

C&R: century. Century has the root "cent." The plural is centuries. A century is 100 years. You can remember that there are 100 cents in a dollar, so there are 100 years in a century. Century -100, 100-century
