
No Opt Out Options Flowchart

Students in your classroom need to know that it's alright not to know the right answer to a question, but that not knowing is not an excuse for not trying. Use one of the *No Opt Out* options below to ensure that students who respond to a question with "I don't know," or "I can't," or an incorrect or partially correct response, end the sequence with a correct or valid answer.



One way that you can make this activity more rigorous in your classroom is to follow up the *No Opt Out* answers with a request for another correct answer (in addition to the one the student gave) or by asking for the student to explain the "why" behind the correct answer.
